Red Nose Day - Friday 20th March 2026

Children's Mental Health Week

This week is Children's Mental Health Week. We have been exploring this year's theme, 'This is My Place'. Feeling a sense of belonging helps children feel safe, valued and understood. For our students, belonging isn't about fitting in — it's about being accepted exactly as they are, having predictable spaces, trusted people, and routines that support their emotional wellbeing. We place a strong emphasis on helping every child feel that this is their place.

Throughout the week, children have been exploring what makes them feel calm, safe and happy, whether that's a favourite activity, a special person, a sensory space, or a familiar routine. These experiences help build emotional security, which is the foundation for learning, communication and confidence.

Thank you for everything you do to support your child's wellbeing every day. Together, we are helping our children build a strong sense of place, connection and belonging — at school, at home, and beyond.

Ideas for Supporting Belonging at Home

- Create a cosy "safe place" - A beanbag, blanket, or small tent with familiar items for calming moments.
- Use photos and visuals - Family pictures, pets, favourite staff or places help build connection.
- Offer small choices - Two snacks, two activities, two outfits — simple but empowering.
- Share calm time together - Music, a favourite show, sensory play — presence over pressure.
- Keep routines predictable - Visuals or simple schedules can reduce anxiety and increase confidence.
- Name feelings gently - "You look calm," "I can see you're worried" — validating and safe.

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What's Next – Transition Event

We have planned this year's transition event for parents/carers and young people to explore post-school options. The event will be held on Friday 15th May, between 10am and 12.30pm in the school hall at Foreland Fields School. Once again, this year's event has been jointly organised by both Foreland Fields School and Stone Bay School.

This event is an opportunity to look at post-school options by meeting with a range of providers and identifying support and resources available in the local area.

This event is targeted at parents/carers of students aged 14 and above however, should other parents/carers wish to attend, they are welcome.

A real highlight of the day was the opportunity to meet two England Boccia World Champions, who spent time talking with the students and watching them play. They were especially complimentary about Keller Class, praising them not only for their skill but for how polite, kind, and welcoming they were to everyone they met.

School Uniform

A reminder that all students, other than those in our 6th Form and Key Stage 4 college (EKC) attendees, should come to school dressed in school uniform.



We understand that some variation is helpful in order to meet certain student needs, e.g. jogging bottoms rather than traditional school trousers and plain white polo shirts for those who require frequent changes.

Official uniform can be purchased from the Schoolwear Centre in Margate (01843 293555) however, we are happy for students to wear items of the same colour that do not contain the school logo. We ask that parents name all clothing.

Children of all ages need a basic PE kit and students may need clothing for more specific activities from time to time, e.g. waterproof jackets and wellington boots for Forest School.

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Holidays During Term Time



At Foreland Fields School, we believe we offer a supportive approach to attendance and encourage our families to contact us should there be any barriers to their child attending school.

Headteachers are not permitted to agree leave of absence during term time unless they are satisfied that there are exceptional

circumstances. School attendance guidance emphasises that 'a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance'. Could I please ask that parents do not book holidays or visits during term time as I am not permitted to authorise them.

Exceptional circumstances could include:

- Service personnel returning from a tour of duty abroad where it is evidenced the individual will not be in receipt of any leave in the near future that coincides with school holidays.
- Where an absence from school is recommended by a health professional as part of a parent or child's rehabilitation from a medical or emotional issue.
- The death or terminal illness of a person close to the family.
- To attend a wedding or funeral of a person close to the family.
- Where there are exceptional and unforeseen circumstances that fall outside of the above.

Please note, evidence will be required in each case. It is the decision of the Headteacher how many days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.

World Book Day 2026

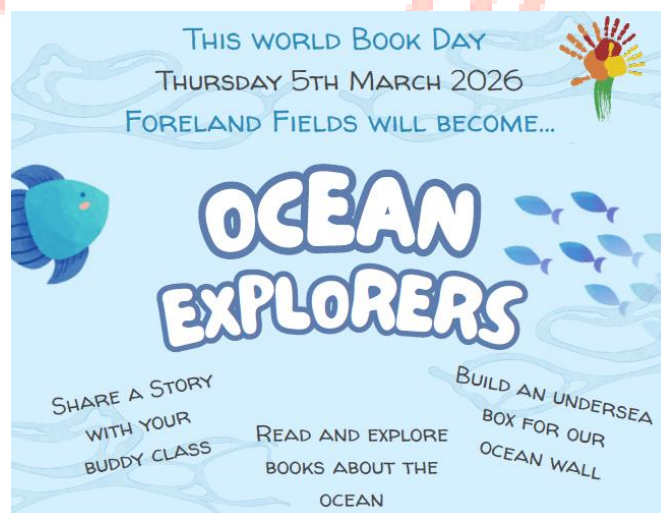
Students are invited to come to school dressed up as a favourite character on Thursday 5th March.
