Reporting Absence

When a child is absent from school, parents/carers should phone into the school office by




9.00am on the first morning of absence and keep the school updated on a daily basis of any further absence. Any absence not reported in this way has to be recorded as 'unauthorised'. This is a safeguarding requirement in order that all parties know that children are safe and their whereabouts are known.

Can we remind parents/carers that absence should not be reported on ClassDojo, or through drivers/escorts.

Holiday During Term Time

Please be aware that time off for holidays during term time will not normally be granted. Headteachers are not permitted to agree leave of absence during term time unless they are satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances.

Where leave of absence is not agreed and the pupil or student is out of school, or an application has not been made in advance, the absence is recorded as unauthorised.
