





# **Foreland Fields School Newsletter - October 2021**



### Lateral Flow Device Testing – Secondary Students

Secondary students, who are able to, are asked to continue testing during the October break. We ask that they take 2 Lateral Flow Device (LFD) tests over the week and take an additional test either the night before or the morning of their return to school (2<sup>nd</sup> November). Could we please ask that parents/carers inform their class teachers by email or ClassDojo of the results of these tests.

Test kits have been sent home over the week however, should parents/carers require any over the break, they can be ordered online at <u>https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests</u>

Should a child test positive from a home LFD test, parents/carers should book a PCR test to confirm the result.

### Positive COVID-19 Reporting over the October Break

Should any pupil/student test positive for Coronavirus (COVID-19) over the break, they will be contacted by Test and Trace who will ask for details of close contacts. Should any pupil/student, having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school (that is up to and including Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> October), test positive can we ask that parents/carers inform us by email in order that we can liaise, as necessary, with Public Health England and, if required, inform close contacts. Parents/carers should inform us via the generic email account: <u>foreland@foreland.kent.sch.uk.</u> This email account will be monitored on a regular basis at the beginning of the holiday. Could we ask that parents/carers inform us of the date that their child first developed COVID-19 symptoms or, in the event of them being asymptomatic, the date the test was administered. Parents/carers of any child identified as a close contact will receive notification via ClassDojo or email.

Please note, parents/carers are not required to inform us if a pupil/student tests positive having developed symptoms more than 48 hours after being at school (specifically after Monday 25<sup>th</sup> October). Parents/carers should, however, liaise with NHS Test and Trace.







### Fireworks

We have had a huge response for our firework tickets. Unfortunately, with such high demand, we have had to limit tickets to 6 per family. Please be aware that we will only permit entry to those who have purchased a ticket prior to the event.



Admittance is through the secondary entrance. Could we please ask that



everyone arrive promptly as doors will be shut at 6.30pm in order to ensure that everyone can enjoy the display.

Please note; Foreland Fields School is a no smoking site. The use of

sparklers or any other kind of personal firework is not permitted, so please do not bring them with you to the event. Dogs will not be admitted.

Should the event need to be cancelled due to adverse weather conditions, we will notify parents/carers on the day through ClassDojo and our website.

# Parking

Could I please remind parents/carers that they should be parking in the school car park, or the right side of the staff car park if this is full, and walking their child into school using the pathways and zebra crossings. Can we ask that parents do not park in the minibus bays. We understand that traffic, particularly in the mornings, can get very busy however, we cannot allow risks to be taken in order for children to be dropped off.

# **School Uniform**

Could I please ask parents/carers to ensure that their child attends school in full uniform. We fully appreciate that some children will only tolerate jogging bottoms or shorts or require other variations, which we are always happy to accommodate however, other than our 6<sup>th</sup> Form or First Leap Nursery pupils, all other pupils/students should be wearing school uniform.

Please ensure that all clothing is clearly marked.

in Margate. Should you have any concerns about uniform, please speak to Sharon Bremner, our Family Liaison Officer.







Illness



Many of our pupils and students are vulnerable to infections which can spread quickly at this time of year. Remember, your child should be kept away from school for 48 hours from the last period of sickness or diarrhoea.

Any pupil displaying any of the symptoms of COVID-19 should not come to school, and should, if possible, book a PCR test. The main symptoms are:

- High temperature this means feeling hot to touch on the chest or back (you do not need to measure temperature).
- New, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if a person usually has a cough, it may be worse than usual).
- Loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means not being able to smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

### Whole-School Events

It is great that we can once again start planning whole school events. We are looking forward to seeing many of you at the firework event and we are in the process of planning other events throughout the year.



We are however mindful that it would not be responsible for us to plan large whole-school events which will lead to large groups of people inside the school therefore, we are planning how to hold events, such as the Christmas Fair, safely without taking the enjoyment out of the event. We will be in touch in regards to Christmas events early in the new term.







# Absence/Lateness

Could I ask that all parents/carers ensure they phone into the main office to report a child's absence. Parents/carers whose children travel on school transport should inform the driver or passenger assistant that their child is not attending however, parents/carers still have a responsibility to inform the school. Messages cannot be passed through drivers or passenger assistants.

School times are 8.30am (school starts at 8.40am) until 2.50pm other than Thursdays when school ends at 2.00pm.

In the event that a child is late for school, they need to be brought to the main reception where classroom staff will be contacted to collect the child. If you need to collect your child early for an appointment, please ensure that the class team know in advance.

It is important that every effort is made to ensure pupils arrive on time in order that they are prepared for the school day.

### **Christmas Jumper Day**

On Friday 17<sup>th</sup> December, which is also the last day of term, it will be Christmas Jumper Day where we will all be wearing our festive knitwear. Pupils/students and staff are all welcome to come to school wearing their Christmas jumpers.


# **Staff Training Day**
