Doors will open at 5.45pm with the main event starting at 6.30pm. Could we please ask that everyone arrive promptly as doors will be shut at 6.30pm in order to ensure that everyone can enjoy the display.



Please note, Foreland Fields School is a no smoking site. The use of sparklers or any other kind of personal firework is not permitted, so please do not bring them with you to the event. Dogs will not be admitted.

Should the event need to be cancelled due to adverse weather conditions, we will notify parents/carers on the day through ClassDojo and our website.

### Arrangements for the Beginning and End of the School Day

Outside the front of the school are a number of disabled parking bays. These spaces, which

are marked as disabled bays, have dropped kerbs and are wider to accommodate vehicles with tail/side lifts. They are intended to be used by parents/carers of children who require the use of a wheelchair. Could we please ask that any parents/carers whose child does not use a wheelchair does not park in these bays in order to ensure all children can enter and exit school with ease.



Could we also remind parents/carers not to walk in the roads outside school but to use the pathways. We need to set an example to our young people and show them that it is not safe to walk around busy traffic.



### The Balanced System®

In July 2017, Foreland Fields School was first accredited as a Centre of Excellence for our work supporting speech, language and communication needs. We recently went for re-accreditation and are pleased to announce that we have been awarded Centre of Excellence status for a further 3 years.

The report states that the school 'demonstrates high quality evidence and a robust approach to provision for SLC (speech, language and communication) across the school'.

Special recognition must go to Nikki Gray, our Communication and Literacy Lead, for coordinating and leading our bid for re-accreditation and for her ongoing work supporting the speech, language and communication needs of children and young people across the school.



Later today (Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October) we are due to be holding our annual Harvest Festival event. We have already received food donations which will be donated to the homeless / poorly housed. We will be holding a special assembly to be presented by Samuel Hearle from Queens Road Baptist Church.

### Reception

Due to the high volume of people using the reception area, can we please ask that at the beginning and end of the school day, parents/carers wait outside until their child is collected by staff/brought to them, and do not wait in the reception area.



#### Illness

Many of our pupils and students are vulnerable to infections which can spread quickly at this time of year. Remember, your child should be kept away from school for 48 hours from the last period of sickness or diarrhoea.

#### The current guidance is:

- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and, where possible, avoid contact with other people. They can go back to an education or childcare setting when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough.
- It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.
- If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and, where possible, avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test.

EVIDENCE FOR LEARNING Family All parents/carers should now have received login details via email for the Evidence for Learning Family App. This enables teachers to share video evidence of your child's progress. It also enables you to share video of your child achieving at home, so that we can include this in their assessment and Learning Journeys. You can download this app for free from the Play Store/App Store.

If you have not received any login details – please could you inform your child's class teacher with an up to date email address, so that we can resend log in details to you.
