### Arrangements for the Beginning and End of the School Day

Outside the front of the school are a number of disabled parking bays. These spaces, which are marked as disabled bays, have dropped kerbs and are wider to accommodate vehicles with tail/side lifts. They are intended to be used by parents/carers of children who require the use of a wheelchair. Could we please ask that any parents/carers whose child does not use a wheelchair does not park in these bays in order to ensure all children can enter and exit school with ease.

Could we also remind parents/carers not to walk on the roads outside school but to use the pathways. We need to set an example to our young people and show them that it is not safe to walk around busy traffic.

As you are aware, we are having ongoing issues regarding the volume of traffic on the school site and, in particular, vehicles parking on Newlands Lane which is blocking traffic coming on and off the school site. We ask that parents/carers do not park on Newlands Lane or the grass verge by the farmers field, especially in front of the farmers gates, as this is making traffic movement more difficult and is also doing nothing for neighbour relations.

### Gymkhana (July 2024)

This event occurred at the end of the last academic year, but unfortunately due to the timing was not included on the end of term newsletter. We however, feel it was to good an event not to report about.

Our pupils, who accessed horse riding throughout the year, were able to attend a Gymkhana, designed especially for them, to show off their skills. Each pupil was observed by a judge and at the end they were awarded rosettes and medals for their differing achievements. It was lovely to see the parents who came to support

With this in mind, over the coming months we will be running 'test' events for the Hive ahead of creating a programme of more regular events. We have a really diverse school population, so we want to try to ensure that across the offer, we are able to meet all pupil needs.
