Global Peace Games

This saw our students joining young people from across the world who all came together to promote friendship, understanding and peace. In total, 60 representatives from 16 countries participated in the event.

Illness

Many of our pupils and students are vulnerable to infections which can spread quickly at this time of year. Remember, your child should be kept away from school for 48 hours from the last period of sickness or diarrhoea.

The current guidance is:

- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and, where possible, avoid contact with other people. They can go back to an education or childcare setting when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough.
- It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.
- If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and, where possible, avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test.

The Children's Bookshow

On Wednesday (19th October), 30 students attended the Children's Bookshow at St. Lawrence College. We saw Neal Layton, an author and illustrator, who demonstrated how he built up his ideas to write and publish a book. He was really funny and, as one of the students said afterwards, "I didn't know you could use a stick as a musical instrument". Every student attending had the opportunity to take home two books, so we hope you enjoy looking through them together over half term!!
