Fireworks Event

We will be holding our annual firework event on Thursday 6th November. Doors will open at 5.15pm, with fireworks at 6.00pm. Please note, this is an earlier time than previous years. Tickets are priced at £5 per head for adults and £3 for children aged 16 and under. Under 3s go free. Tickets can be purchased by returning the tear-off slip sent out earlier this week or directly from the main office.



Could we please ask that everyone arrive

promptly as doors will be shut at 6.00pm in order to ensure that everyone can enjoy the display.

Please note, Foreland Fields School is a no smoking site. The use of sparklers or any other kind of personal firework is not permitted, so please do not bring them with you to the event. Dogs will not be admitted.

Should the event need to be cancelled due to adverse weather conditions, we will notify parents/carers on the day through ClassDojo and our website. Please note, the decision to cancel is made purely by Viking Fireworks who stage the display, not the school.

Arrangements for the Beginning and End of the School Day

As you are aware, we are having ongoing issues regarding the volume of traffic on the school site and, in particular, vehicles parking on Newlands Lane which leads to traffic gridlock. We ask that parents/carers do not park on Newlands Lane or the grass verge by the farmers field, especially in front of the farmers gates, as this is making traffic movement more difficult and is also doing nothing for neighbour relations.

Outside the front of the school are a number of disabled parking bays. These spaces, which are marked as disabled bays, have dropped kerbs and are wider to accommodate vehicles with tail/side lifts. They are intended to be used by parents/carers of children who require the use of a wheelchair. Could we please ask that any parents/carers whose child does not use a wheelchair does not park in these bays in order to ensure all children can enter and exit school with ease.





Could we also remind parents/carers not to walk on the roads around and within school but to use the pathways. We need to set an example to our young people and show them that it is not safe to walk around, and within, busy traffic.

We appreciate that parents/carers may struggle at the beginning and end of the school day to pick up/drop off children, especially if they have children who attend multiple schools. However, we are not able to sanction parents bringing their children late, or picking them up early, unless there are exceptional reasons for them to do so. Please be aware that Foreland Fields School opens at 8.30am and ends at 2.50pm. We are more than happy to speak with parents/carers should they have any issues with school drop off or pick up.


Students based at the main Foreland Fields site are welcome to attend in non-uniform or Halloween themed fancy dress.

Gymkhana 2025


At the end of last academic year (July 18th), students who had attended horse riding sessions through the year, were able to show off the skills they had gained in front of a judge at the Gymkhana.

Thanet Disabled Riding Centre are amazing with our pupils, accommodating their needs, building positive relationships, supporting their social and communication skills as well as their physical skills.









Reporting Child Absences
